III. PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

2011-present Professor and Senior Scientist, Center for the Study of Higher Education, The Pennsylvania State University.

1995-present Regent Professor and President Emeritus, University of Illinois. Dr. Ikenberry maintains appointments at Penn State's Center for the Study of Higher Education and

at the National Institute for Learning Outcomes Assessment in the College of Education on the University of Illinois Urbana Champaign campus. Dr. Ikenberry is active as a national speaker and consultant.. He serves as advisor to doctoral students in the field of higher education and teaches courses on higher education policy and leadership.

- 2008-present Co-principal investigator National Institute for Learning Outcomes Assessment (NILOA). NILOA was established to monitor and assist institutions as they develop evidence for student learning. This project is funded by Lumina Foundation, Carnegie Corporation of New York and The Teagle Foundation. Dr. Ikenberry provides oversight for the research activity and the administration of this project.
- 2009-2010 Interim President University of Illinois. Dr. Ikenberry resumed the role of president of the University during a transition of leadership in 2010.
- 1996-2001 President, American Council on Education. As president of the American Council on Education, Ikenberry served as the major voice for higher education in the United States. ACE's membership includes about 1,600 accredited, degree-granting colleges and universities and more than 200 national and regional higher education associations.
- 1979-1995 President, University of Illinois. For 16 years Ikenberry was the chief academic and administrative officer of the University of Illinois. Elected by and responsible to the Board of Trustees of the University, he was the 14th President of the University. He led the consolidation of the University's Medical Center and Chicago Circle campuses to form the current University of Illinois at Chicago, now the largest and most comprehensive research university campus in metropolitan Chicago. In Urbana-Champaign, Ikenberry led several major academic initiatives, including the creation of the Beckman Institute for Advanced Science and Technology and the National Center for Supercomputing Applications. Ikenberry led the University's first major capital campaign and launched a second campaign in the late '80s to raise in excess of a billion dollars. The quality and diversity of the Illinois student body increased significantly during his tenure with his creation of the President's Scholars Program. Ikenberry left the University presidency in 1995 and assumed the presidency of ACE the following year. He returned to the University in his current capacity in September 2001.
- 1978-1979 Senior Vice President for Administration and Professor of Higher Education, The Pennsylvania State University. Stan Ikenberry was one of the three senior officers responsible to the President of the University. He was concerned with the central administration and operations of the University at its 22 locations in Pennsylvania. His special focus included intermediate and long-range planning; policy development; coordination of relations with the State Board of Education and with other institutions of higher education in Pennsylvania; relations with the press and other external constituencies; and responsibility for certain administrative services.
- 1971-1978 Senior Vice President for University Development and Relations and Professor of Higher Education, The Pennsylvania State University. Responsibilities similar to those outlined above. The title change by the Board of Trustees in March 1978 was made to reflect more accurately the breadth of responsibilities.
- 1969-1971 Professor of Higher Education and Associate Director, Center for the Study of Higher Education, The Pennsylvania State University. Responsibilities included research and

development activities in the Center for the Study of Higher Education. Senior member of the Graduate Faculty. Graduate instruction responsibilities in the Division of Educational Policies.

- 1965-1969 Dean, College of Human Resources and Education and Associate Professor of Education, West Virginia University. Responsible for the overall academic leadership and development of the College. College included academic divisions of education, Clinical Studies, Social Work, Family Resources, and the Human Resources Research Institute. Academic programs were offered at the Undergraduate and graduate levels through the doctorate.
- 1964-1965 Special Assistant to the President. Responsibilities included direction of a University planning and development effort to consolidate the organizational structure of the University.
- 1962-1965 Assistant to the Provost for Institutional Research and Assistant Professor of Education, West Virginia University. Responsible for the development and implementation of a program of institutional research. Also served as an assistant to the Provost of the University. Joint appointment to the faculty of the College of Education.
- 1960-1962 Instructor, Office of Institutional Research, Michigan State University. One of the four professional staff members responsible for the development and implementation of a program of institutional research at Michigan State University. Promoted to Assistant Professor July 1, 1962.
- 1958-1960 Instructor, Office of Evaluation Services, Michigan State University. Full-time research position, U.S. Office of Education research project: Critical Thinking, Attitudes and Values in Higher Education. Project Director: Paul L. Dressel. Project Coordinator: Irvin J. Lehmann.
