AGREEMENT
between
THE PENNSYLVANIA STATE UNIVERSITY
and
THE CENTER FOR EUROPEAN STUDIES
at the
UNIVERSITY OF MAASTRICHT

It is agreed that:

1. A group of students from The Pennsylvania State University (hereafter referred to as PSU) will be enrolled in the Center for European Studies of the University of Maastricht (hereafter referred to as CES) for the academic program described below from (date) to (date).
2. Within the frame of this program, CES will offer two academic tracks in which PSU students will enroll:

a) A liberal arts track consisting of two block periods:

- 1) During block period #1 (September and October), students will be required to take *Dutch Language and Culture* **or** *Intercultural Communications* plus one additional course selected from the following cluster:

Compartmentalization of Man
The European State
Comparative European Literature
Legal and Political Aspects of European Integration
Comparative European Economics
Course of Human Life

- 2) During block period #2 (November and December), students will be required to take two courses from the following cluster:

Psychopathology
The Good Life
Democratic Perspectives
Dutch Art History
The EU: Economic Foundations and Policy Issues of Integration
Literature and Ethics
Environment, Technology, and Global Development

b) A business studies track consisting of two block periods:

- 1) During block period #1 (September and October), students will be required to take *Dutch Language and Culture* **or** *Intercultural Communications* plus one additional course selected from the following cluster:

International Management and Business Policy
Strategic Management
Relationship Marketing and Direct Market Management
Change Management and Business Processes

- 2) During block period #2 (November and December), students will be required to take one course from each of the following two clusters:

Comparative Management
Advertising Management
Human Resource Management
Financial Management
Economic Sociology

Organization Structure

Management Accounting I
Behavioral Finance
International Business Research Methods

3. For the foregoing program, CES will appoint appropriate academic staff to conduct all classes and seminars, assign and evaluate papers and/or projects, and administer and grade examinations of the students' achievement. The academic staff will be responsible for evaluating each student's performance and for submitting grade reports to the PSU office of International Education Programs and Studies for each of the courses at the conclusion of the program.
