





Klinger Presents at 76th Annual Correctional Education Association International Conference

Chrissie Klinger (Workforce Development Specialist, Institute for the Study of Adult Literacy) presented at the Correctional Education Association International Conference and Training Event in Tampa, FL in August.

Chrissie presented *Collaborative Career Coaching*. The session helped participants explore how correctional education and community organization staff can work together to provide career coaching to individuals behind and



beyond the walls. Examples of collaborative career-related reentry service approaches were shared, including Integrated Education and Training ideas. Participants received materials and resources that could be used to help individuals affected by the justice system explore, enter, and progress along career pathways that align with their skills, interests, and abilities.

Ideas shared at sessions will be incorporated into a Career Exploration Fair Toolkit that is being developed by the Workforce Development System Liaison project. More information about the toolkit will be released later this year.
